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Who we are and what we do...

Applying UN objectives



The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are seventeen goals to make the world a better place in 2030. They are a global compass for challenges such as poverty, education and the climate crisis. Kolewa's work contributes to these goals.

Good care and a strong society: The social structure in Indonesia is different from that in the Netherlands, which is why the Kolewa team focuses on communities. A child who cannot receive good care remains a concern for the community. Because the child can lead a normal life again, a future is created, not only for the child, but for the entire community around the child. That is why Kolewa's work is so effective, we not only help the child, but strengthen the future of the entire community of often dozens of people. Because this concerns the poorest in Indonesia, we provide extra support to create a healthy living environment for the child. In this way, we contribute to SDG 3: Good care and Well-being and SDG 10: reducing inequality.

Identifying children in need of medical care: With the Medicar, the Kolewa team travels to poor areas in Bali where people live who are unable to visit a hospital or doctor themselves. Posters inform the population about the possibility of having cleft lip and palate children operated on free of charge. Midwives, who play an important role in the villages, are often the first to notice that something is wrong with a child. The Kolewa team tells about the other activities of Kolewa during meetings of midwives affiliated with Puskesmas (child health clinic). The children who qualify for care and shelter in Rumah Bicara are born with cleft lip and palate, hearing impairment, anal atresia, spina bifida and children who have suffered burns. Our Medicar is equipped with first aid items, such as bandages, baby food, pacifiers, clothing and vitamins, so that – if necessary – first aid can be provided immediately. The Medicar, and our Suzuki minibus, are also used to transport children to the hospital in Denpasar. With this we support SDG 3: Good Healthcare and Wellbeing.

Healthcare for children of Indonesian islands: Indonesia has very isolated and poor islands such as Timor, Rote, Flores, Sumba and the Moluccas. Medical care is limited and surgical interventions are impossible. That is why our Kolewa team accompanies patients from other islands for examination and operations to the hospitals in Bali: SDG 3 Good Healthcare and Wellbeing.



Clean water supply: A large part of the Indonesian population does not have a connection to the tap water and because bottled water is unaffordable for them, they are dependent on river or rainwater. Drinking this highly polluted water causes diseases, especially in children. Kolewa offers a simple and cheap solution by means of the Water Filter Set. This consists of two buckets and a Tulip the filters. With this we support SDG 6: clean water and sanitation.

Baby food, food parcels and aids: We support the poorest communities in their basic needs. Children with cleft lip and palate need a basic weight to be able to undergo their operation. Unfortunately, these children do not always have that. We provide baby food so that the desired weight is achieved. A few times a year we bring a food parcel with a supply of rice, noodles, oil, flour and other basic products. With this we contribute to SDG 2: no hunger.

Health insurance: In we have a state insurance for poor people, the BPJS. This insurance does not provide relief for cleft lip and palate patients. For the other conditions that Kolewa focuses on, the reimbursement is often not sufficient. Kolewa then supplements where necessary. We encourage patients and caregivers to register for this. In this way we support SDG 3: good Care and Well-being.



Transforming Lives through Surgical Intervention:


This year, Yayasan Kolewa continued its vital mission of providing life-changing surgical interventions to children in need. Numerous young lives were positively impacted through the organization's unwavering commitment to addressing critical medical conditions that could be effectively treated through surgery.

Yayasan Kolewa's work encompasses a range of crucial activities:

- Identification and Assessment: Working closely with hospitals in Denpasar, and healthcare professionals to identify children in need of surgical intervention and to determine the most appropriate course of treatment.
- Covering the full spectrum of surgical costs: Pre-operative assessments and consultations, post-operative care and rehabilitation, medications and medical supplies
- Logistics and Coordination: Arranging transportation for children and one of their family-members to reach designated medical facilities. Providing accommodation and support during their stay at the hospital.
- Coordinating with medical teams to ensure seamless and timely care
- In total we offered 131 children born with cleft lip and palate a medical journey and 25 patients with Burns, anusatresia or spina bifida.

All surgery took place in Bali; most patients came from NTT, NTB and Moluccan islands.

Scouting and monitoring is on each island supported by local free-lance scouts.


Kolewa team members took in 2024 frequently domestic flights to guide patients and guardians. We collaborated with Dharma Yadnya Hospital and Bali Mandara Hospital.



















Pre-surgery Dental Care, speech therapy, woundcare and daily activities such as creativity and going outside.

Pre-surgery dental care is crucial before plastic surgery on cleft lip or cleft palate for several reasons: Poor oral hygiene can lead to infections, which can significantly increase the risks associated with surgery. All kids above 5 years do go to field partner Dental 911 for a check-up.

At Kolewa Foundation, we understand that healing is more than just medicine. While our commitment to providing top-notch medical care remains unwavering, we recognize the profound impact of play and recreation on a child's overall well-being, especially during challenging times.

Hospital stays and medical procedures can be frightening for children. Playtime offers a much-needed escape, allowing them to relax, unwind, and forget their worries for a while.

Our Kolewa Foundation team does believe that a holistic approach to care is essential. By providing a nurturing environment where children can play, laugh, and simply be kids, we contribute significantly to their emotional, social, and physical wellbeing.


















"Longstayers": Anusatresia, Spina Bifida and Burns.

Patients with anorectal malformations (ARM), burns, and spina bifida often require significantly longer stays in shelter homes compared to those with cleft lip or palate.

ARM: These conditions involve abnormalities of the anus and rectum, often requiring multiple surgeries and complex post-operative care. Bowel function may need to be re-established gradually, which can take time.

Burns: The severity of burns varies greatly. Extensive burns necessitate prolonged hospitalization and rehabilitation due to the risk of infection, scarring, and potential complications like contractures.

Spina Bifida: This neurological condition can cause various issues, including paralysis, bowel and bladder problems, and hydrocephalus (fluid buildup in the brain).

Management involves multiple surgeries, therapies and longterm care.



















All treatment for our so-called "longstayers" took place in the Ngoerah Hospital in Denpasar using the BPJS insurance.

The average stay of length in our shelter home is six to 9 months, sometimes up to one year.

Every week we distributed 100 fresh meals to people working in the garbage, street sellers and parking attendants in Denpasar city. A token of appreciation for the poorest of the poor.





Special support to former patients and families in need:

Ingky, living in Kupang Timor, is our former burns patient; we offered him a scholarship in Kupang at the University for agriculture. He graduated in September 2024.

Families with a baby, born with cleftlip/palate, received babyfood support to gain weight.

On a regular base we deliver a food pack to people with a very low income in Bali and Kupang.

Patrick, again a victim of a burn-accident living in Kupang, has also a severe eye-problem. He needed new glasses to be able to perform good in school.

Angel, a girl with spina bifida in Kupang, needed in 2024 financially support for transportation to the SLB-school and buying special diapers to solve her incontinentie problem. She came to Bali last August to get new special shoes at Annika Linden center



In special cases we made sure that very young & poor couples get support by setting up their household. Together with local hotels we brought them a mattress, bedsheets, towels and furniture.

















Offering a helping hand to the blood bank in Bali

The Kolewa Foundations' supported with healthy meals for blood donors at on-location blood drives in Bali, it was incredibly helpful to the Bloodbank for several key reasons:

Blood donation can cause temporary side effects like dizziness or fatigue. A nutritious meal helps replenish energy levels and stabilize blood sugar, ensuring donors feel better faster.

Providing a meal shows appreciation for the donors' time and generosity, creating a more positive and supportive experience that encourages repeat donations.



















Children with hearing problem

Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia

Using sign language for communication changes their lives, but first, we test hearing loss carefully! A large group (over hundred) of kids and parents is already following our program for years.

"In Denpasar, located not too far from the Kolewa Foundation, is Lumina Hearing Center. Equipped with facilities for testing young children, this center provides easy access for our patients with hearing problems.

During our outreach activities across Bali, we regularly identify children with hearing impairments. In such cases, we offer assistance and free hearing tests at the Denpasar center.

Many of the children and parents who seek our help require special education. These children often live in isolation and do not attend school. If parents avail themselves of our free testing and device offers, they agree to enroll their child in our weekend speech therapy and sign language program.

Parents also expressed a strong desire to learn themselves and practice sign language to improve communication with their deaf child.

In 2024, we continued our specialized parent training program twice a week in Denpasar (30 participants) and Karangasem (45 participants). The overwhelming enthusiasm of the participants has resulted in significant progress in their communication with their deaf or hard-of-hearing children at home."

Kolewa organizes weekly speech therapy and sign language classes to support children with hearing problem. These sessions designed to help them improve their communication skills and build confidence. Classes are held both in Denpasar and Karangasem, ensuring accessibility for more families in need. We received numerous donations of hearing aids and batteries, which were distributed to Lumina to support Kolewa's deaf children.

Speech therapy and sign language classes for children with hearing impairment in Denpasar and Karangasem did run smoothly. Our field partner, Lumina Hearing Centre, and the teacher from Sushrusa School joined our program in Karangasem twice a month on Sunday morning. The kids in Denpasar regularly come directly to Lumina Hearing Center to maintain their hearing aids and ensure their devices are in good condition.













Special education for deaf and badhearing children in Bali.

"Twenty-one Kolewa children with hearing impairments attend the Sushrusa Deaf School in Denpasar daily for specialized sign-language education. Our driver, Komang, transported them to and from school using our dedicated school bus. Twice a week, these children also come to our shelter home for supplementary lessons and a nutritious meal.

It is truly inspiring to witness the children's growth, their enthusiasm for learning, and their eagerness to thrive. We cherish the opportunity to see them perform and regularly invite them to showcase their talents at our events."

In december the kids were invited to the Christmasparty, organized by Rotary Club Bali Nusa Dua.

"A Day at the Ranch: An Unforgettable Experience for our Deaf Children"

For our deaf Kolewa children, a recent visit to the horse-riding center in Ungasan was an unforgettable adventure. Many had never even seen a horse before, let alone ridden one!

The day began with an introduction to the horses. The children learned about their different breeds, sizes, and personalities. They were taught how to approach a horse safely, how to groom them, and how to lead them. The staff at the center were incredibly patient and communicated using a combination of sign language and gestures.

The highlight of the day, of course, was the riding experience. With the help of experienced instructors, each child was carefully paired with a horse suited to their size and confidence level. They learned basic riding positions and how to guide the horse with gentle cues. The smiles on their faces as they felt the rhythm of the horse beneath them were priceless.

Beyond the riding, the children gained valuable life skills. They learned about responsibility, patience, and respect for animals. They also developed their communication skills, both in sign language and through observation and interaction with the horses.

This experience was more than just a fun outing; it was a valuable opportunity for our deaf children to connect with nature, build confidence, and expand their horizons. It was a day filled with joy, laughter, and unforgettable memories.

- *They enjoyed a picnic lunch at the ranch.
- *The children shared their experiences with each other using sign language.













Family gathering Ambon



Every year, the Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia team organizes a "family gathering" on one of the island groups. This year, we invited children from the Moluccan islands of Ambon and Seram to participate in a weekend event in Ambon city.

During these gatherings, we conduct follow-up check-ups on children who have undergone surgery. Sometimes, the jaw doesn't develop correctly, or palate issues arise. We also provide additional speech therapy and dental hygiene lessons. While the children are engaged in arts and crafts activities, the parents participate in seminars.

This year, interns Maud and Lieke gave presentations on personal hygiene. Team member Uttari, a midwife, discussed pregnancy, childbirth, and infant care. A delegation from the government health insurance program, BPJS, explained the benefits of having government health insurance.

In total, 32 children came to the family gathering, each accompanied by at least one parent. The Kolewa team arrived a day in advance to welcome them."

A large number of the children present had already undergone at least one surgery in Bali. They stayed in our care home, "Rumah Bicara," for a few weeks, and even there, they learned the importance of good oral hygiene. However, it never hurts to reinforce this message, so each child received a new toothbrush and toothpaste."

















It was an incredibly exciting and rewarding moment for the Kolewa Foundation to receive such recognition from Plt. Yan Aslian Noor, MPH, Head of the Dinas Kesehatan (Health Office) in Ambon, during the family gathering! This kind of appreciation not only highlights the foundation's dedication to our work, but also validates the impact we are making in the community. Having the Head of the Health Department acknowledge our efforts in front of a gathering of families was both humbling and motivating for everyone involved. It's moments like these that strengthen our foundation's resolve to continue making a difference and inspire others to get involved too.













Kolewa Foundation partnered in October with The Lions Club Bali to distribute 15 Tulip water filters to families in need in the Karangasem region. During the distribution, Foundation Chair, Ana, emphasized the transformative impact of these filters, providing access to clean water for families living in extreme poverty. These families often lack access to basic necessities, including clean drinking water," Ana explained. "The Tulip water filters are a game-changer. They not only provide safe drinking water, but also significantly improve the health and well-being of these families, particularly children."


In total we visited 63 families that don't have acces to clean drinking water. 63 complete sets in Karangasem and Tabanan area. Besides that we made unannounced home visits to families who had previously received a waterfilter. We were satisfied to see that most of these people use the filter in the right way. For those who were using the filter alsmost two years we changed 48 candles in Bali.



In 2024, Kolewa Foundation received consistent support from our Dutch counterpart, Stichting Kolewa. These donations, fourth time a years. Generated through fundraising efforts in the Netherlands, were crucial in sustaining our charitable programs. In december 2024 we received in advance for the first semester 2025 IDR425.000.000.

Furthermore, the Rotary Club Bali Nusa Dua generously contributed towards the costs of accommodating Cleft Lip and Palate (CLP) patients and their transportation to hospitals.

Additionally, the invaluable support of visitors, churches, and local entrepreneurs, often in the form of goods and food donations, significantly supplemented our resource.

The year 2024 commenced with a strong financial footing, boasting an opening balance of IDR 1,942,418,904, inclusive of the advance payment for the first quarter of 2025. Throughout the year, Yayasan Kolewa Harapan Indonesia received a total of IDR 5.143.819.867. This significant inflow comprised generous support from our Dutch counterpart, Stichting Kolewa, contributions from compassionate visitors, and a substantial grant from the Rotary Club Bali Nusa Dua towards our cleft lip & palate project.

Furthermore, our prudent financial management yielded IDR 92.250.966 in interest income.

In fulfilling our mission, Yayasan Kolewa diligently utilized IDR 3,425,587,156 to implement various impactful projects across our programs. This expenditure aligns with our budget projections, which estimated total costs at IDR 3,745,500,000.

This responsible financial stewardship allows us to enter 2025 with a strong financial position, enabling us to allocate a portion of our remaining funds towards the initiation of new projects that will further enhance the well-being of the communities we serve in 2025 - 2030.
